ASH, GREEN	Fraxinus pennsylvanica	Grows 50-60 ft. An upright spreading, fast growing tree. An excellent choice for shade, farm wood lots and windbreaks.	12-18"	25

ASPEN, QUAKING	Populus tremuloides	Grows up to 75 ft. One of the first trees to pop up after a timber harvest or fire. Noted for its brilliant fall colors, leaves turn bright yellow, yellow-orange, gold, or reddish after the first frosts. Grows well on sandy, gravelly soils but thrives on clay loam in full sunlight.	12-18"	25
BIRCH, RIVER	Betula nigra	Grows over 40ft. Tolerant to many soil conditions. Resistant to bronze birch borer.	6-12" 12-18"	25 25
BIRCH, WHITE	Betula papyrifera	Moderate to fast growth with a mature height up to 70ft. This tree will do well in moist, well-drained soil and full sun areas.	6-12"	25

BUTTON BUSH	Cephalanthus Occidentalis	Grows 5-10ft. A small bush that has attractive summer foliage with creamy-white flowers appearing in late summer.	6-12" 12-18"	25 25
CHERRY, BLACK	Prunus serotina	Grows over 60ft. Hardy, large tree with rough, dark brown bark. Leaves are oblong with white flowers in late May. Fruit bearing.	6-12"	25

CHERRY, NANKING	Prunus tomentosa	Grows 8-10ft. This is one of the earliest flowering prunus species. A broad spreading shrub. Pink to white fragrant flowers followed by edible scarlet fruit in June. Foliage is a very attractive soft green.	6-12" 12-18"	25 25
CHOKECHERRY, COMMON	Prunus virginiana	Small tree with white flowers and dark purple fruit that is edible. Fruit is used for making jelly and wines. Great food & cover for wildlife.	6-12" 12-18"	25 25
CRANBERRY, Highbush	Viburnum trilobum	Grows 8-12ft. Attractive foliage turns red and orange in the fall. Flat clusters of white flowers followed by red berries.	6-12"	25

DOGWOOD, GRAY	Cornus racemosa	Grows to 10ft. A tall, dense growing shrub. White flowers in late spring followed by white berries in late fall-early winter. Good for wildlife. Does well in a variety of soils. Full to partial sun.	6-12"	25

DOGWOOD, RED OSIER	Cornus sericea	Grows to 10ft. A broad erect grower with dark blood red branches. White flowers followed by white berries. Great choice for erosion control projects. Also provides good food and cover for wildlife.	6-12"	25

ELDERBERRY	Sambucus canadensis	Grows 5-12ft. Fast growing small tree/shrub. Tolerates wide range of growing conditions. Small white flowers grow in large clusters in early summer followed by edible purplish black fruit. Attractive to birds.	6-12"	25

HACKBERRY	Celtis occidentalis	Grows to 40-60ft. Will grow to a medium to large tree or shrub with large spreading branches. Moderately drought tolerant, but does best in moist well-drained soils. Used for windbreaks and highway plantings.	6-12"	25

HAZEL NUT	Corylus americana	Grows up to 12ft. A large fast growing shrub with showy spring flowers. Edible brown nuts. Grows best in moist, well-drained soils but will adapt to most soil types. Full sun or deep shade. Attracts wildlife such as deer, grouse, turkeys, pheasants & quail.	6-12"	25

HEMLOCK, CANADIAN	Tsuga canadensis	Grows to 40-70ft. Does good in moist soil with good drainage. Shade tolerant. Can be pruned to maintain desired height. Lacy, graceful growth with yellow-green needles in spring changing to glossy green.	6-12"	25

LILAC	Syringa vulgaris	Grows 12-15ft. Delicate fragrant purple flowers in May. A perfect informal hedge or screen.	6-12"	25

MAPLE, FLAME	Acer ginnala	Grows 15-18ft. Tolerates a wide range of soil. Small tree or multi-stemmed shrub. Brilliant autumn foliage ranging from orange-red to deep red.	6-12"	25

NANNYBERRY	Viburnum lentago	Grows up to 18ft. Prefers rich loam to clay loam soil with ample moisture. A wildlife shrub or can be pruned into a small tree. White flowers in spring followed by berries. Fall color deep maroon to red.	6-12"	25

NINEBARK	Physocarpus opulifolius	Grows 5-10ft. Upright dense spreading shrub. Has white or pinkish flowers in spring and red colored seeds in fall.	6-12"	25

OAK, BURR	Quercus macrurca	Grows up to 80ft. Tolerates a variety of soil conditions. Leaf color is dark green in summer and yellow to yellowish brown in fall.	6-12"	25

OAK, PIN	Quercus palustris	Height: 40-60ft. Fast growing tree with rusty-orange to red color in the fall. Does best in well-drained soil.	6-12"	25

OAK, RED	Quercus rubra	Grows up to 80ft. Great shade tree. Fast growing and long-lived oak. This acorn tree provides food and shelter for wildlife and can tolerate city conditions. Also commercially valuable to the lumber market.	6-12"	25

OAK, WHITE	Quercus alba	Grows up to 80ft. Very hardy shade tree. Dark green leaves, typical oak leaf shape that turns bronze in fall. Slow growing and extremely long lived. Excellent in wildlife plantings.	6-12"	25

OAK, SWAMP WHITE	Quercus bicolor	Grows up to 60ft. Does well in moist to wet soils and upland areas. Shiny dark green leaves that turn yellow to purple in the fall. Their sweet acorns are great for wildlife	6-12"	25

PLUM, AMERICAN	Prunus americana	Grows 15-20ft. A small tree or large shrub. White flowers in early May. Yellow to red edible fruit in June-July. Very hardy & drought resistant. Excellent for wildlife plantings.	6-12"	25

POPLAR, HYBRID	Populus	Grows approximately 75ft. An extremely fast growing tree with large leaves giving lots of shade in a hurry.	12-24"	25

RUGOSA, ROSE	Rosa rugosa	Grows up to 10ft. Excellent hedge plant with fragrant flowers (pink, white, & purple) from June-August. Tolerates most soil types. Great choice for wildlife plantings.	6-12"	25

SERVICE BERRY, ALLEGHENY	Amelanchier laevis	Grows to 25ft. Small, upright multi-stemmed tree. Does well in most soil types. Full sun to partial shade. White flowers followed by purplishblue fruit. (delicious in pies and jams). Orange-red fall foliage.	6-12"	25

FIR, BALSAM	Abies balsamea	The traditional Christmas tree. Excellent fragrance with good needle retention. Prefers well-drained, acidic, moist soil. Full to partial sun.	3-5"	50

FIR, CONCOLOR	Abies concolor	Grows over 35ft. Soft needles vary from silvery-blue to silvery-green. Grows best in well-drained soil and full sun. (Will not do well in heavy, clay soil.)	7-15"	25
FIR, FRASER	Abies fraseri	Grows up to 40ft. A medium sized pyramidal with horizontal, stiff branches, excellent ornamental and a classic christmas tree choice. This tree not only has an excellent fragrance but exceptional needle retention. Likes cool, moist, well-drained soil. Full to partial sun. (Will not do well in heavy, wet clay soil.)	3-5"	50

PINE, AUSTRIAN	Pinus nigra	Grows up to 60ft. Fast growing and is noted for its stiff, long green paired needles. Grows well in most soils. Tolerates drought and extreme temperatures.	4-8"	50

PINE, RED	Pinus resinosa	Grows over 35ft. Rapid growing tree with 4-6" long, glossy-green needles. It has many uses: timber, windbreak, ornamental and Christmas tree. Does well in sandy soil.	4-8"	50

SPRUCE, BLACK HILLS	Picea glauca densata	Grows over 35ft. Short, stiff dark green needles and a spicy scent. Extremely hardy, withstanding heat and dry growing conditions. Used as ornamental, windbreak or as a Christmas tree.	4-8"	50

SPRUCE, COLORADO BLUE	Picea pungens glauca	Grows over 35ft. Slow growing, densely formed tree with stiff, silvery-blue to bluish-green needles. An excellent ornamental and background tree. Thrives in dry, well-drained soils.	6-12"	50
